

HOODIE MAKE OVER – Part 2

- Taking a hoodie apart.
- Draw a pattern from the pieces.
- Think about your layout for your patchwork pieces.
- Do you want to quilt any pieces with embroidery?



Overview

- Deconstructing the hoodie
Seam Ripper vs. Scissors
- Keep ribbing intact
- Iron all the pieces
- Trace the pieces for a pattern - Front, back, sleeve, hood.
- Mark the pieces, centers, any added seam allowance, hood drawstring openings



Next Steps



- Start to envision your completed project.
How many patchwork pieces are you going to use?
Are you going to machine quilt any pieces?
Do you plan to add embroidery designs, monogram, etc?
Are you going to have a hood?
- Complete your layout. Even draw it out.
- Start cutting your patchwork pieces for the front, back, sleeves and hood.
- Serge or machine sew the pieces together

Homework

- Take apart a hoodie.
- Trace and mark your pieces.
- Quilting any pieces is optional.
- Cut the patchwork pieces for front, back, sleeves and hood. Keep in mind you need to end up with patchwork pieces larger than your pattern pieces.
- Keep stretch and nap in mind when using Cuddle
